Chateau de Fere



September 25 - 27 (Two Nights) Deluxe Room Category Breakfast and Dinner Included

On the Road of Coronations, in 1206, Comte Robert II of Dreux, grand-son of the King of France Louis VI, acquired the land Fere, and there erected a fortress. In 1539, Anne de Montmorency turns the Fortress into a Luxury Castle and built in 1560 a Viaduct of Pur Style Renaissance replacing the medieval bridge.

The castle was dismantled in 1779 to sell the furniture and materials component. The building was converted into a Castle Modern in 1863. This was one of the first castles that have been converted into a hotel in 1956.

This quiet countryside hotel will be our first stop as we explore the Champagne Region.

<u>Hotel Villa Lara</u>

Our 5 star Luxury Boutique Hotel with a chic but casual atmosphere is located in the heart of the Bayeux historic center, facing the Cathedral, steps from the famed Tapestry and very close to the D-Day landing beaches. Bayeux, the first town liberated in June 1944, will be the perfect location for our touring in Normandy.

Chateau d'Artigny

The white stones of the majestic Artigny Castle, the dream Belle Époque castle of François Coty, the famous perfumer, may be seen from a distance as they rise above the Indre Valley. Twenty-five hectares of park containing a French garden, marble statues, woodwork and trompe l'oeil frescos. No expense was spared in the creation of this beautiful residence, now an elegant castle hotel located south of Tours. A restful spot to call home while touring the lovely chateaux of the Loire Valley.



Hotel Alfred Sommier



October 3 - 5 (Two Nights) Superior Room Category Breakfast Included

In 1860, Alfred Sommier and his father, who were entrepreneurial sugar refiners, had built their "hotel particulier" in la Madeleine district. They wanted to settle their family and to entertain, in a mansion corresponding to the prosperity of their business. Well preserved, Alfred Sommier's "hotel particulier" has now been transformed by one of the descendants of the family into a luxurious hotel which keeps the soul of the family mansion.

From the entrance porch, you step into the intimacy of a 19th century mansion with a peaceful courtyard and garden. You will feel welcomed as a family guest.

Thursday, Sep 26- Reims, Epernay


We depart this morning for Reims. There will be a morning city tour which also includes the Cathedral (a UNESCO world heritage site). It played a significant role in French history for over 800 years as this is where the kings of France were crowned.

We'll have time to enjoy lunch at one of the many outdoor cafes.

After lunch, we take a short drive on the Route de la Champagne to see the rolling hills filled with endless vineyards. We'll stop in Epernay for a visit to Mercier Cellars.

Friday, Sep 27- Giverny, Bayeux

This morning we move on to Normandy. Our first stop will be in <u>Claude Monet's village</u> of <u>Giverny</u>. There we will visit both his home and gardens.

Claude Monet lived for fortythree years, from 1883 to 1926, in his house in Giverny. With a passion for gardening as well as for colors, he conceived both his flower garden and water garden as true works of art. Walking through his house and gardens, you can still feel the atmosphere which reigned at the home of the Master of Impressionism and marvel at the floral compositions and water lily pond, his greatest sources of inspiration.


After the visit, you will have some time to have lunch at leisure in the village. Then, we will drive to <u>Bayeux</u> for a three night stay.



D-DAY 75TH ANNIVERSARY NORMANDY TOUR

On June 6 in 1944, 135,000 men and 20,000 vehicles were brought onto the shores of Normandy via five landing beaches during the night. You will see the Normandy invasion with a private guided tour and discover: the D-Day landing beaches, airborne sectors, D-day battlefields and D-day museums.

This tour will take you to sectors where the American V Corps and VII Corps landings occurred at Omaha and Utah beaches. You will follow the steps of the famous 1st, 29th, and 4th American Infantry Divisions and the other units that linked up with them. You will also be taken to the drop zones of the 82nd and 101st Airborne Units that landed in the early morning hours of the D-Day Invasion on June 6, 1944. The American Cemetery of Colleville along with several other notable sights will also be on the tour itinerary.




Sunday, Sep 29-Two Options Available

Option 1: D-Day 75th Anniversary Normandy Tour - Cont'd

This 101st Airborne Tour is an exceptional tour and will be of great interest to those who saw Steven Spielberg's famous miniseries, Band of Brothers. This tour will enable you to link the movie locations with the real places of the paratroop landings onto Normandy. Many sites on this tour are inaccessible to most other tour companies, and remain secluded from entry. However, due to the generosity of various land owners and our personal relationship with them, you will have the privilege of seeing places like Brecourt Manor, and many other places where Lt. Winters and members of Easy Company stayed during the first nights of the Invasion.





Sunday, Sep 29

Option 2: Normandy Cider and Cheese Tour

For my foodies, a visit to Normandy isn't complete without savoring a fresh glass of cider made with apples from the region's abundant orchards and tasting the local Camembert cheese. Of course, a ride through the Normandy countryside is always a treat within itself.

We'll have a relaxing day to enjoy our tastings. Lunch will also be included in Camembert for this option. You'll be back in Bayeux mid afternoon to enjoy the rest of the day at leisure.









Monday, Sep 30-Loire Valley

We depart for the Loire Valley this morning. We will stop in Vouvray for an included picnic in a private vineyard and then proceed to our hotel to experience living in a french chateau!

The Loire Valley is one of the most beautiful and interesting regions of France with numerous historic castles and towns to explore during our visit here. Many of these date from the 15th to 17th centuries when the region was much loved by many of the French Kings and noblemen, who competed to build ever more elaborate and luxurious chateaux.

Tonight, we will enjoy dinner in the private dining room of Mr. Cody. An elegant experience to start our stay in the Loire Valley.









VISITING THE FRENCH CHATEAUX

LOIRE VALLEY

Tuesday, Oct 1: Chateau and Garden Visits

<u>Chateau de Chenonceau</u> is the most visited and photographed chateau in the Loire Valley. It is well furnished with Renaissance furniture, a good collection of 16th and 17th century tapestries and a great number of masterpieces. The gardens are absolutely stunning.

<u>Chateau Cheverny</u> is one of the best preserved castles in all of France. It has the most decorated rooms of any of our visits to Loire valley castles and the quality of the decorations is impressive. The Cheverny kennels that will be included on our tour were created in 1850 to house more than 100 hound dogs used for hunting.

<u>Chateau Chambord</u> is the most impressive of the castles of the Loire. What particularly distinguishes this castle, already very impressive by itself, are the wondrous spires, chimneys and pinnacles that arise on many of the roofs and terraces.

Dinner included at your leisure this evening at the hotel.

Wednesday, Oct 2- Two Options Available

Option 1: Chateau and Garden Visits

<u>Chateau of Villandry</u> is the last of the great chateaux of the Loire built during the Renaissance. The sober elegance of its architecture combined with the charm of its outstanding gardens make this one of the jewels of the Loire Valley.

<u>Chateau Azay le Rideau</u> is one of the loveliest and most visited chateau of the Loire Valley. It was built during the reign of François I in the Renaissance style by Gilles Berthelot on the site of a former small fortified castle, its turreted façade is reflected in the still waters of the river making time itself appear to stand still. Inside the chateau, all the rooms are furnished, which is not true of all the chateaux of the Loire Valley, in a variety of period styles making the visit even more pleasurable.

Option 2: Golf de Touraine

Please Note- Green fee, cart and club rental not included in tour rate

This 18 hole golf course in the heart of the Loire Valley Chateau country, was designed by an English architect Michael Fenn in 1971 assisted by one of its members Gerard Crouzat-Reynes, ex-President of the National Sports Commission of the French Golf Federation. The main features are its technical difficulty and the quality of the upkeep of the golf course. Through the undulating and tree lined fairways, are to be found several entirely natural water hazards. It's noted for their beautifully kept fairways manicured over the years, with its small and rapid greens.



Thursday, Oct 3- Paris

We will say "Au revoir" to the countryside chateau and press on to our final destination. Always a highlight to any trip to France, Paris will be the perfect place for our grand finale. You will be warmly welcomed to the hotel with light refreshments upon arrival. This mansion, kept in the Sommier Family for several generations, has kept the building's authenticity and charm while turning it into a landmark hotel of Parisian elegance.

The rest of the day is yours to enjoy at your own leisure. If you would like reservations for museums, restaurants, Eiffel Tower or any other activity, please let me know in advance and I will be happy to arrange for you.



Friday, Oct 4- Paris

You are welcome to join a walking tour this morning with our guide Emmy that features the highlights of the Right Bank. We will finish our tour near the entrance of the Louvre. This will place you in the center of Paris with many options to complete your afternoon and evening touring at your leisure.
